UNDERSTANDING YOUR IMAGE STRUCTURE

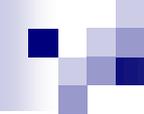


IMAGE ANALYSIS

- Look at your image and ask what is the main subject?
- Does the eye automatically focus on and come back to this?
- If not why?
- Cropping might help to improve composition (rule of thirds etc.)
- But does the background compete with or complement the main subject?
- What can be done to improve the image?



**DIFFERENTIAL PROCESSING OF
THE SUBJECT AND BACKGROUND**



REMOVE DISTRACTIONS

- Are there any small highlights that need to be removed
- Are there any other distracting elements in the background
- Leave the image and come back to it after a few days to see if you have missed anything

CREATE SUBJECT/BACKGROUND MASKS FOR SEPARATE EDITING

- Carry out any basic post-processing adjustments
- Make separate masks/layers for main subject(s) and background
- First edit the main subject to optimum for:
 - Exposure, levels/curves, saturation, colour balance, clarity, sharpness etc
- Then edit the background layer to complement/enhance the subject again using similar controls

SOME SIMPLE EXAMPLES



IF THE BACKGROUND IS RUBBISH OR YOU WANT A DIFFERENT ONE

- Using your normal image editor cut out the main subject
- Paste onto a new background which suits it better
- Simple!!
